Priority in camp is given to participants in the After-School Program who attended over 30 days during the school year.

What is the reason?

A 21st Century Community Learning Center grant funds both the After-School Programs and Summer Camps to offer year-round out-of-school time learning and enrichment free for full-time Lopez youth in grades K-8.

In these programs, regular attendance matters! Campers who attend regularly build routines, learn to support each other, cultivate lasting friendships, and grow in their ability to communicate. They show higher engagement, receive access to more resources, and have an overall more positive experience.

Camp Read-a-Rama

Literacy immersion at it's best! Every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday during Camp Huckleberry, campers will start their day with a mini Camp Read-a-Rama! Animated storytellers will lead with a book that echoes the theme of the week, and then engage their small group in a discussion that helps campers connect with the themes in the book.

Campers then get to dive deeper into the book by exploring an art and a science/sensory station that helps each child "LIVE BOOKS"!

Whether it's controlling LEDs and servo motors or working and reading from various sensors, such as ultrasonic, infrared, and temperature, campers will use their creativity and imagination while building their coding skills in C++.

No prior knowledge of Arduino or coding is required. For beginners or advanced coders - the projects can be tailored to each participant. Participants will need basic computer skills.
